

# SPI Training and Technical Assistance (TTA)

As the SPI technical assistance (TA) provider, CNA has several means of helping SPI grantee sites achieve their goals and desired outcomes, such as:

<b>Targeted Technical Assistance</b>	Focused technical assistance sessions, provided either by telephone or during an on-site visit. For on-site technical assistance visits, CNA develops an agenda and presentations (if required) prior to the visit. A CNA SPI team member (staff and/or SME) will visit the site in person to provide the requested assistance. <b>Peer-to-peer Exchanges</b>	SPI grantee sites share best practices and lessons learned on specific Strategies for Policing Innovation issues. <b>Meetings</b>	National meetings and regional workshops provide SPI sites the opportunity to gather together and discuss important issues pertaining to Strategies for Policing Innovation, such as project implementation and expectations, lessons learned, best practices, effective research partnerships, evidence-based policing, and sustainability.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Learning SPI best practices and lessons learned</li> <li>Sustaining Strategies for Policing Innovation principles</li> </ul>
